His editorial, conceptual and connective illustration work follows a varied corporate career in design and the arts, which sharpened his focus on communication and messaging. While some of his creations are complex, he also seeks increasing levels of simplicity. Greg is also a writer, branding consultant, ceramist and collage/mixed-media artist. He loves sci-fi, nature, molecular topics and the color yellow.

Some of Vineyard's past highlights include being juried into national tile and teacup shows and having a tea bowl in the Sam & Alfreda Maloof Foundation in Alta Loma, CA. His Meditation/Keepsake Bowls, which were featured on HGTV's Carol Duvall Show in 2005, have been collected as far away as Italy, Japan and India.

One of his porcelain tea bowls was recently selected by the Mint Museum for their 75th Anniversary show, "Collecting North Carolina Pottery for 75 Years", at Seagrove, NC.

Since August of 2009, he has been a monthly contributing writer for Rapid River Arts & Culture Magazine, and two of his photographs were selected for their covers in 2011. His latest in a long series of conceptual shows, presented in 2011, was entitled "Mis-Community-Cation". Featuring his "Communication Animal" series, visitors were prompted to react and interact with figures and dioramas.

In 2012, Greg solidified his commitment to help daily through his vision, "Charity366!" (for 366 days, due to leap year), where he donates 10% of his art sales proceeds all year to Craft Emergency Relief Fund (www.craftemergency.org), and by donating an average of one artwork per month to fundraisers.
